



"His faith was not shaken by the diagnosis. Instead, it was illuminated. Kim expressed complete trust in God's plan, saying that whatever comes, he knows he is held in love."

CLC-USA and the United Nations: A Call to Mission

Do you feel called to be part of a CLC UN Working Group?



CLC is part of the larger Catholic presence at the United Nations, which affords us the opportunity to collaborate with other Catholic and faith-based groups on four issues of mutual importance.

CLC belongs to four Non-Governmental Committees:

1. NGO Migration Committee / Climate-Induced Migration Subcommittee
2. NGO Committee on the Status of Women / Indigenous Women Subcommittee
3. NGO Mining Working Group / Indigenous Subcommittee
4. NGO Indigenous Committee

Currently, we have a small but very active CLC team based in New York, where the UN headquarters is located. We hope to incorporate more CLC members working in these areas, as it is vital to provide meaningful two-way communication between grassroots communities and our representatives at the UN.

World CVX-CLC and CLC-USA are currently seeking and missioning a few members in Metro NY to join our UN working group, specifically in the New York office.

While a sensibility for social justice and compassion for the poor are essential, the profile of members in the working group includes:

- Availability to attend virtual and/or in-person monthly NGO subcommittee meetings (about 2 per month)
- Participation in monthly online working group meetings (about 1.5 hours)
- Ability to interpret information relevant to both the UN and CLC grassroots communities
- Support for communications within our international community (e.g., articles in Progressio, social media, website postings)

Fr. Jim was a member of CLC, EA for the MAR Region, and received the Development of People's award at the 2004 national assembly. He was a great friend to all!


Wheeling University will name its Center for Service in honor of Father James A. O'Brien, S.J., who spent more than 50 years at the University teaching and serving others.

Dr. Dianna Vargo, University President, said, "Naming the Center for Service in honor of Father O'Brien is most appropriate. Living the very essence of our Catholic mission, Father O'Brien inspired students to serve others.

The Father James A. O'Brien Center for Service will develop and organize projects with campus partners to undertake service projects at the University, in the city of Wheeling, and in the state of West Virginia.

Father O'Brien's niece, Pat (O'Brien) Keys, class of 1980, said "We are all so proud of his quiet, humble accomplishments, his beautiful connections with everyone, his acceptance of all whose paths crossed his, and the life long lasting impact he had on all of us who were blessed to go to Wheeling College, Wheeling Jesuit College, Wheeling Jesuit University, and Wheeling University. The Father James A. O'Brien Center for Service is a wonderful way to honor his legacy of service to the University, the Wheeling community, and the state of West Virginia," Keys said.

Father O'Brien hoped people would remember him as a person of faith. He once said, "There is a line in an old verse that said one should 'live by the side of the road and be a friend to those who pass by.' That's what I have tried to do - be a faithful person to God and others."

KCLC NY: MEN'S RETREAT AT BENEDICT ABBEY: A JOURNEY OF HEALING AND HOPE

On September 20–21, the Korean Christian Life Community in New York hosted a two-day men's retreat at Benedict Abbey in Newton, New Jersey, welcoming 15 participants—including 7 non-CLC members.

Guided by Fr. Benedict (Sung-Ho) Kim, the retreat offered deep spiritual renewal through lectures, Eucharistic celebrations, and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Participants were invited to face their past and present selves with honesty and grace, and to embrace the Ignatian way of life: living with prayerful awareness, discerning God's will, and preparing for the later stages of life.

Small group sharing and plenary conversations created a space of vulnerability, joy, and holy desire. Many described the retreat as a profound encounter with God's grace—quenching spiritual thirst and renewing strength for the journey ahead. The men left Benedict Abbey encouraged to walk more faithfully with Christ, strengthened in companionship and mission.

METRO MEMBER BEGINS FORMATION IN SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

This September, **Joanne Carey** of Metro CLC (Staten Island) began a two-year formation program in Spiritual Direction through SEEL (Spiritual Exercises in Everyday Life), offered jointly by St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia and Loyola Jesuit Retreat House in Morristown, NJ. Rooted in the Ignatian tradition, the program prepares individuals to guide others through the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius. Joanne will begin directing in Fall 2026 and complete the program in May 2027.

Her journey began with the 19th Annotation retreat at her parish in 2012–2013, followed by discernment into CLC with Fr. Dan Fitzpatrick. She made her formal commitment to CLC in May 2025.

Beyond CLC, Joanne serves as a volunteer in the baths at the Sanctuary in Lourdes, France, and is a member of L'Hospitalité Notre Dame de Lourdes—the original group of volunteers serving pilgrims since the apparitions to St. Bernadette.
